Medicaid Services

Our trained clinicians provide counseling, education, related support and other tools to assist individuals and families. Clinicians meet with individuals discuss presenting problems and assist them in the development of treatment goals. Services are provided in the home, community or school setting, as well as at our Canal Street office. Individuals are also offered the opportunity to apply for Medicaid, if they are not currently enrolled. During the appointment, the individual can select a Bayou Health insurance plan and register to vote.

Programs and Services

General Counseling

General counseling services offer trauma-informed clinical interventions to address a variety of socio-behavioral challenges that individuals, children, couples and families face. By calling Family Service, you can schedule an intake appointment. During the appointment, a clinician will meet with you to discuss your presenting problems and treatment goals.



Anger Management Group

Evidence-based educational, and therapeutic approaches are used to deal with feelings of anger and frustration. Constructive methods of self-expression are taught that result in rewarding outcomes. Participants attend 12 weekly group sessions.

Youth Wellness Initiative

Youth who are in need of school based or office based behavioral health services are able to access services at no cost to the family. Children must be 17 years of age or under and have parental consent to participate.

NOLA Dads

The NOLA Dads Program utilizes individual sessions, educational groups, and mentoring to support young men on their journey to becoming better dads. The 24/7 Dad® evidenced-based curriculum is used and focuses on increasing awareness, improving knowledge, and developing the skills that aid in becoming better prepared and more present fathers. Participants are connected to community resources as needed. NOLA Dads is a 12-week group program that meets weekly in the community as well as at our Canal Street office.

Victims of Crime Program

Whether it is past or more recent victimization, survivors of crime are provided with a safe and confidential space to process and alleviate symptoms of trauma. The Victims of Crime Program typically works with those who have been victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, physical assault and child abuse. These services can also be provided to survivors of any crime. The Victims of Crime Program utilizes evidence-based models and provides services individually, in the home, the community and our Canal Street office.

Batterer Intervention Program

This program is designed to help men and women stop the use of violence in their relationships. The program utilizes the Duluth Model, one of the most widely used domestic violence interventions. Participants attend 26 weekly group sessions at our Canal Street office.

Healthy Relationships

Psychoeducational groups and individual sessions are offered to teens and young adults. Topics focus on respectful conflict resolution, effective communication skills, and violence-free relationships. This evidenced-based 12-sessions program is offered weekly in the community, schools and at our Canal Street office.



Orleans Parish Drug Court

Individuals must be referred through the Orleans Parish District Court. Evidence-based interventions support individuals to lead safe, drug-free lives.

A-CRA

Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach is a nationally recognized evidenced-based Intensive Out-Patient program using pro-social activities, behavioral interventions and community assets to support recovery.

Diversion Program

Psychoeducational groups are offered to individuals referred through the court system for first-time minor offenses. Through 12 weekly sessions, participants learn about decision-making skills, anger management, communication and other factors that can contribute to criminal behavior. The Diversion Program uses the Thinking for a Change Model to help adjust problematic behaviors.
